


INSTRUCTIONS FOR NOTICE OF FUNDING AVAILABILITY (NOFA)
ISSUED 12/22/09
APPLICATION DEADLINE FEBRUARY 5, 2010



During Fiscal Year 2010-11, Federal grant funds will be available under the Community Development Block Grant Program and the HOME Investment Partnerships Program. Both of these Federal grant programs are administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

For Fiscal Year 2010-11, the City anticipates receiving approximately \$1,256,000 in CDBG funds and \$30,000 in program income. Of this amount, \$188,400 will be available for public services and \$816,400 will be available for capital development projects. In addition, approximately \$364,000 in HOME monies will be available for affordable housing projects.

Any individual, group or organization wishing to apply for 2010-11 funds must complete and submit the original and one copy of the attached application form. PLEASE DO NOT HOLE PUNCH OR STAPLE THE ORIGINAL OR THE COPY. Please do not attach cover letters, supplementary information or letters of support to the application. Please submit only those attachments requested as part of the application. No other supplementary information will be accepted. Please do not use binders or special covers. The application may not exceed 10 pages excluding the required attachments. Please use 12 point font size or larger.



A separate application form must be submitted for each proposed project or activity. However, if you are applying for the same project or activity under more than one source of funding only submit one application and indicate the multiple sources of funding on the budget form. There are three application forms, one for CDBG capital development projects, one for CDBG public service activities, and one for HOME affordable housing projects. In addition to printed copies, the application forms are available on disk or can be electronically mailed. Copies of the Federal Guidelines for Eligibility, the current HUD Income Limit Schedule, the City's criteria, and last year's priorities are attached to assist the applicant in determining if a particular project or activity is eligible for funding. After receiving the applications, the Block Grants Advisory Committee will evaluate the applications, rank the project proposals and make recommendations for funding.

The deadline for submittal of completed applications is Friday, February 5, 2010, by 5:00 p.m.

All applications and comments must be submitted to the Special Projects Division office located at City Hall, 110 East Cook Street, Room #2, Santa Maria, CA 93454. Applications will be stamped with the date and time received to verify that they have met the deadline.

A MANDATORY pre-application workshop to assist applicants in preparing an application will be held on Monday, January 18, 2010, at 10:00 a.m. in Shepard Hall at the Santa Maria Public Library, 421 South McClelland, Santa Maria, CA.
