PROCLAMATION – NATIONAL AMERICAN INDIAN HERITAGE MONTH

Councilmember Zacarías read a proclamation declaring the month of November 2008 as “National American Indian Heritage Month” in the City of Santa Maria and urging the residents to observe this month and participate in the appropriate programs, ceremonies and activities. Bob Ziener complimented the Council for an outstanding term. He spoke about the newly energized Santa Maria Men’s Club and offered to help with any City projects.

Peggy Jordan spoke about a Trans-National Drug Gang bust in Santa Barbara and said she felt for the City Council and the problems the Council had to face and thanked the Council for keeping the citizens safe.

Paula James distributed pictures from the border with Mexico before and after the border fence was installed and said the Minuteman Civil Defense Corp had been down there fighting to secure the borders for three years.

Billy and Danny Aguilar, 3rd Coast Café, thanked the City for approving their Entertainment License. They had intended to have a fine dining restaurant but have added a nightclub element because of the economy.

Mayor Lavagnino adjourned the Joint City Council/Redevelopment Agency Meeting and reconvened the Regular City Council Meeting.

PROPOSITION 50 INTEGRATED REGIONAL WATER MANAGEMENT PLAN SUBGRANT AGREEMENT AND MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE SANTA BARBARA COUNTY WATER AGENCY.

Director of Utilities Sweet gave the staff report. The City Council is requested to adopt a resolution approving a Proposition 50, Round Two, Step Two Integrated Regional Water Management Subgrant Agreement with the Santa Barbara County Water Agency (Agency) relating to the State Water Resources Control Board's approved grant funding for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Expansion Phase II Project in the amount of \$4.8 million, and approving a Memorandum of Understanding between the Agency and other local agencies and special districts for grant administration and receipt of the Proposition 50 grant funds. California's Prop 50 grants are the result of the Water Security, Clean Drinking Water, Coastal and Beach Protection Act of 2002, and provide funding for a range of water-related plans and projects. Since 2006, the City has been involved in an effort, coordinated through the Agency, to prepare a Countywide Integrated Regional Water Management Plan (IRWMP) involving 29 water agencies. This same effort resulted in the submission of a January 14, 2008, Prop 50, Round Two, Step Two grant application to fund \$25 million in significant projects identified in the IRWMP. Two out of the 15 projects within the grant proposal were beneficial to the City: the Wastewater Treatment Plant Expansion Phase II Project submitted by the City and a Levee Reconstruction Feasibility Study submitted by the County Flood Control District. On June 3, 2008, the State Water Resources Control Board approved draft funding recommendations of \$25 million for Santa Barbara County including \$4.8 million for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Expansion Phase II Project. The State Water Resources Control Board requires that the Prop 50 Grant Agreement be entered into with a single recipient representing the IRWMP region. The Santa Barbara County Water Agency is willing to serve as the single grantee under the grant agreement and will act as the administrator of the grant entering into subgrant agreements with the project proponents. Grant funds will be dispersed to the Agency, and the Agency will reallocate the funds to the project proponents for activities associated with the Prop 50 projects.

Ernest Armenta asked what the grant was for.

Director Sweet explained that the \$19.6 million Wastewater Treatment Plant Expansion Phase II project was currently under construction, and the \$4.8 million grant would help pay for a portion of the construction costs.

QUARTERLY FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE FIRST QUARTER ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2008, AND A BUDGET AMENDMENT REPORT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2008-09.

Director of Administrative Services Snodgrass gave the staff report. With 25 percent of the year complete, revenues are at 16.3 percent of projections while expenditures are at 23.9 percent of appropriations. Total revenue and transfers are \$9 million which is \$998,400 more than last year. Departmental expenditures are \$13.3 million, approximately \$301,300 more than the prior year. Operating costs are less than budgeted totaling 23.9 percent for the year. In the Water/Wastewater Fund, revenues exceeded expenses by \$1.1 million, primarily as a result of Department of Water Resources and Central Coast Water Authority fixed costs for Fiscal Year 2008-09 which are paid a year in advance as required by agreements. In the Solid Waste Fund, refuse expenses exceeded revenues by \$2.8 million as a result of one-time capital expenditures during the first quarter. The State of California budget gap is estimated to be between \$5 and \$8 million. The Governor has said he would call the Legislature into a special session on November 5th to deal with the crisis, and he has declared a state of emergency. This is a real concern for cities because the words used in the declaration of emergency are the precise language required to enact borrowing of Proposition 1A and 43. The State may decide to cure its budget woes by borrowing from municipalities. The City has positioned itself well for this crisis and will weather the storm. A budget amendment report is included for Council's consideration.

Mayor Lavagnino commended Director Snodgrass and the financial team for their excellent work in keeping the City in good financial condition.

Councilmember Orach commended City staff for their hard work with limited resources.

Councilmember Trujillo also commended Director Snodgrass, City Manager Ness, and City staff for their work in keeping the City solvent.

City Manager Ness announced that an amended Resolution No. 2008-172 was being presented adding a budget allocation related to the purchase of the new Police station which was approved in Closed Session.

Councilmember Zacarías asked why the \$155,000 for the City's share of the Pioneer Valley High School swimming pool had not been included in the budget.

Director Snodgrass explained that it was an oversight.

Amended Resolution No. 2008-172 was adopted approving amendments to the budget for fiscal year 2008-09 and authorizing the City Manager to implement same on motion by Councilmember Orach, seconded by Councilmember Zacarías, and carried on the following vote:

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

City Manager Ness reported on anticipated items for the November 18, 2008, City Council meeting including recommendations from the Block Grant Advisory Committee regarding Youth Services Grant allocations, a proposed ordinance regarding rules of conduct at the new Library, and a one-year anniversary report on the Massage Ordinance.

ORAL REPORTS BY COUNCILMEMBERS

Councilmember Orach thanked the residents who voted today. He asked anyone who happened to see one of his signs to remove and recycle it.

Councilmember Zacarías reported on an event at Rice Elementary School for Parents Involved for Quality Education. When families successfully complete the training, the children receive a guaranteed admission to a Cal State school. She and all members of the City Council attended the dedication of Lavagnino Plaza. She thanked Mayor Lavagnino and his wife, Donna, for the donation of the bronze statue of two children reading books.

Mayor Lavagnino reported that he attended the Empty Bowls event for the Santa Barbara County Food Bank, met with Minuteman Civil Defense Corps representatives, attended the Domestic Violence fundraiser at the Santa Maria Country Club and the Filipino Community dinner, spoke at the Country Oaks Care Center family meeting, unveiled the bronze statue at the Library, attended the charter meeting of the Astra Club at Pioneer Valley High School and the Multi-cultural Literacy Festival at Lavagnino Plaza.

Councilmember Patino reported she and the other Councilmembers attended Joseph Sapien's funeral, on November 3rd she spoke to the Hispanic Business Community, and on Sunday she attended the Multi-Cultural Literacy Festival.

Councilmember Trujillo reported he spoke at the Santa Maria Wisdom Senior Center.
